
DRINKS

Peppernuts

The international guests at LeMUN unfortunately do not know what these little balls are, but in the Netherlands, we call them 'pepernoten'. They are typical for the period before 5 December, the day we celebrate Sinterklaas (the Dutch Christmas). They are a perfect snack for in between debates.

The way you scoop them into your cup is also worth mentioning. By scooping them out of a big bowl with a spoon instead of your hands, we prevent at least 1000+ covid infections per day. Chapeau!

Broodje humus

This sandwich meets all our requirements. The sandwich is not too big, not too small, has a good taste and above all is very healthy. The latter is of course important for our delegates who have to debate all day long. The slices of cucumber are a perfect match with the humus and finish of this sandwich greatly.

Broodje gezond

In Dutch, we also call this sandwich "little bread healthy". This is expressed in the toppings. The lettuce fits well with the fitness lifestyle that we all want. The cheese, according to the internet, is rich in fats, proteins and various vitamins. Love the vitamins!

Egg

This is a recipe that should have been given a second thought. One should expect more from an egg prepared by the catering staff. It is below room temperature and so hard that it almost bounces (sorry, we have tested this) (R.I.P that egg). To be honest, the reviewer has not tasted it either, out of fear of disease. STROOPWAFEL RECIPE

Stroopwafel is a typical Dutch treat. Walking around any market in the Netherlands, you will smell the stand a mile away. The most terrible thing happening when walking around on the market, is not being allowed to have your stroopwafel. You need your stroopwafel.

Stroopwafels are round cookies. They have three layers. The top and bottom layers are a kind of cookie, we call it a waffle. The middle part is the most important, that's the stroop. It's a combination of caramel and cream. It has the perfect texture and the perfect amount of sweetness. Beautiful.



Stroopwafels exist in many sizes. There are normal stroopwafels, 5 cm by 5 cm in a circle. You buy them at the supermarket in packs of 10 pieces. You eat all of them. Then you have the huge ones. The ones from the market. They can get to 15cm by 15 cm. They are still warm when you buy them, the stroop melted and the dough of the waffle softish. It's the best taste ever. At last, you have the mini ones. Really small, about 2 cm by 2 cm. They don't give you the full experience but are cute and tasty.

So, if you want to taste this amazing treat by making them yourself... you can! Here's a recipe. Goodluck!

INGREDIENTS

4 cups all-purpose flour
1 1/8 cups butter, melted
3/4 cup white sugar
2 (.25 ounce) envelopes active dry yeast
1/4 cup warm milk
1 egg
1 1/2 cups molasses
1 1/3 cups packed brown sugar
1/3 cup butter
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

PREPERATION

Step 1

Mix the flour, melted butter, sugar, yeast, milk and egg, together in a large bowl. The dough is ready if it's too stiff to stir. Put it onto a floured surface and knead by hand for a few minutes. Then set it aside to rise for 45 minutes.

Step 2

Next is the filling. First heat the molasses, brown sugar, remaining butter and cinnamon in a saucepan on medium heat. Stir it for a few minutes to blend it and then let it rest.

Step 3

Preheat a pizzelle iron. (Or use a normal baking tray to put in the oven, the shape won't be perfect, but it still tastes the same!) Knead the dough briefly, and divide the dough into 2 inch balls, or a size compatible with your pizzelle iron pattern. Press the balls in the preheated iron, and cook until the iron stops releasing steam, or until the waffles are golden brown.


Step 4

Carefully remove with a knife or spatula, then split in half horizontally (like pocket bread) while they are still warm. Don't wait too long, otherwise they will break. Spread filling on the insides and put the halves back together.

Step 5


Eat up!
